What is the dual credit program?

Dual credit courses are college-level courses taught by high school teachers who have been approved as adjunct faculty of Mount Marty University.

What are the benefits?

This allows students to earn high school and college credits concurrently, at a fraction of the cost.

What are the costs?

\$60 per credit hour.

Courses are 2 – 4 credit hours each; therefore, tuition will run 120 - 240 per course. Students are responsible for paying tuition by the billing due date.

What is the process for registration?

Students will register online: <u>www.mountmarty.edu/academics/dual-</u> <u>credit/</u>. If you would like to receive college credit for both semesters you must register separately for both the fall and spring classes during the dates listed below (unless otherwise indicated).

Drop/Withdraw

Students must contact the registrar's office in order to drop or withdraw a course and must abide by the deadlines to drop as outlined in the academic calendar which can be found in the Undergraduate Catalog.
