# Welcome to Mount Marty University!

### What is the dual credit program?

Dual credit courses are college-level courses taught by high school teachers who have been approved as adjunct faculty of Mount Marty University.

### What are the benefits?

This allows students to earn high school and college credits concurrently, at a fraction of the cost.

## What are the costs?

\$60 per credit hour.

Courses are 2 - 4 credit hours each; therefore, tuition will run \$120 - \$240 per course. Students are responsible for paying tuition by the billing due date.

#### What is the process for registration?

Students will register online: <u>www.mountmarty.edu/academics/dual-</u> <u>credit/</u>. If you would like to receive college credit for both semesters you must register separately for both the fall and spring classes during the dates listed below (unless otherwise indicated).

#### Drop/Withdraw

Students must contact the registrar's office in order to drop or withdraw a course and must abide by the deadlines to drop as outlined in the academic calendar which can be found in the Undergraduate Catalog.
