You and at least one parent (if dependent) must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the financial aid administrator at your school. Your school may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact your financial aid administrator as soon as possible, or within 30 days but no later than the end of the payment period so that your financial aid will not be delayed. Mount Marty College must review the requested information under the financial aid program rules (CFR Title 34, Part 668).
