

Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) Report Report Date: April 2, 2021

On December 27, 2020, the President of the United States signed the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF). Section 18004(a)(1) of the CRRSAA Act offers institutions funds to ease the burden students have experience with their educational paths during the 2020-2021 award year. In accordance with U.S. Department of Education's (ED) guidance, the following information can be accessed via the Mount Marty University's website.

Reporting Requirements:

- 1. Mount Marty University received **\$244,754** to be utilized for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
- 2. As of this report, Mount Marty University has distributed **\$230,400** in Emergency Financial Aid Grants to eligible students.
- 3. As of this report, <u>214</u> students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- 4. Mount Marty University used the following method to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act. To receive Emergency Financial Aid Grant awards, students must meet the following eligibility criteria:
 - Spring 2021 Pell Grant recipient
 - Student must have been enrolled in the spring semester as of March 15, 2021
