

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING

How do I apply?

Applications may be submitted through Nursing CAS at www.nursingcas.org. All communication will be sent through Nursing CAS to applicants regarding their status.

How much does the MSN program cost?

All current cost and payment information can be found online at www.mountmarty.edu/tuition-and-aid/college-costs/yankton-graduate-programs. The MSN-FNP and PMHNP tracks are based on 50 credits each.

Is financial aid available for the MSN program?

The MSN degree program is eligible for financial aid. Applicants can complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Please contact the Mount Marty Financial Aid Office at 605-668-1589 with questions about financial aid. The post-gradute certificate program is not eligible for financial aid.

Is Mount Marty University's Graduate Nursing Program accredited?

The master's degree program in nursing and the post-graduate APRN certificate program at Mount Marty University is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education, 655 K Street NW, Suite 750, Washington, DC 20001, 202-887-6791.

Is the program flexible with the amount of credits I can take?

Yes, we recommend taking 4 to 10 credits each semester. Please keep in mind that taking fewer credits per semester will increase your time in the program. We do not recommend a gap in your coursework of more than one semester.

How often are students required to be on campus?

Two seminars are required each year. The seminars enhance the student experience by providing face-to-face networking with classmates and faculty along with developing hands-on skills. Guest speakers are often utilized to add knowledge and expertise to the student experience.

When is the application deadline?

The application deadlines are February 1 for the May cohort, May 1 for the August cohort, and October 1 for the January cohort. If a deadline is missed, the applicant should call 605-668-1511 to speak to someone from the graduate program about openings or an alternate start date.
